1. Each paper was peer-reviewed by two experts in the field for originality, significance, clarity, impact, and soundness.
In cases of contradictory recommendations, a member of the conference program committee was charged to make the final decision (accept/reject) - often, this involved seeking help from additional referees by using a double-blinded review process.
In addition, all papers whose authors included a member of the conference program committee were evaluated using the double-blinded review process. Chairs of approved sessions were responsible in evaluating the papers that were submitted to them.
2. Authors of accepted papers are strongly encouraged to enhance the organization and the quality of the English writeup of their papers before uploading them to the publication web site for the preparation of the printed books/proceedings.
3. Only those authors whose papers have been accepted SUBJECT to MANDATORY changes will receive the compiled referees' report about THREE days after the date of this email - The referee reports would be sent to such authors by track chairs who arranged the evaluation of your paper or by the coordinator/staff of the conference. Authors who do not receive an email within the next THREE days, should assume that their papers have been accepted without mandatory changes.

WORLDCOMP is the largest annual gathering of researchers in computer science, computer engineering and applied computing. The congress (and the track that your paper is accepted in) will be composed of research presentations, keynote lectures, invited presentations, tutorials, panel discussions, and poster presentations. PUBLICATION:

All accepted papers will be published in the PDPTA 2011 conference proceedings in a printed book form. Later, the proceedings will also be made available online. The proceedings will be indexed in Inspec / IET / The Institute for Engineering & Technology, DBLP / Computer Science Bibliography, and others.) In the past, all tracks of WORLDCOMP have also been included in EI Compendex/Elsevier. Like prior years, extended versions of selected papers will appear in journals and edited research books (a large number of book projects and journal special issues are in the pipeline: Springer, Elsevier, BMC journals, ...) Authors of selected papers will be given the opportunity to submit the extended versions of their papers for consideration; this process will start soon after October 2011.
